It was explained that it contained degrees not available to other bodies which of course made me question, why? Through great explanation as written by M.V.B. Glenson Jones of Capital city Council #154, in his "The-Rites-of Masonry" I learned that these orphan, cast-offs that just needed a home. As explained in his document, an initial Sovereign College was formed by Hartley Carmichael in 1892 but upon his death in 1901 languished until absorbed in 1933 by the Allied Masonic Degrees of the United States, who kindly used the Sovereign College of January 14, 1892, as the Formation date. Even though our inception was not until 1984, our newness doesn't diminish our content.

In our current times we are certainly seeing problematic events perpetrated by evil, greed, and self importance. I admit much of the nationalistic warmongering has me deeply concerned. Fortunately, but maybe with a bias for us on this continent, we have the opinion, right or wrong, of a protecting society.
